<p>The activities listed below are approved by the school board for the completion of the community involvement requirement. Eligible Activities include:</p> <p>Elementary Schools</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> assist with school events, assist School Councils, activities for children; <p>Secondary Schools</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> organization and leadership of school activities that benefit the community; <p>Animal Care</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> volunteering in an animal shelter, or on a farm; <p>Arts and Culture</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> volunteering in libraries, and community productions; <p>Charitable Organizations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> assisting with special events, programs, clerical tasks; <p>Child/Youth Programs</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> assisting with child/youth programs, volunteering in a not-for-profit child care Centre or camp; <p>Community Organizations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> assisting with special events, food banks, community support services, shelters, clerical tasks; <p>Community Service for Individuals</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> assisting community members in need; <p>Environmental Projects</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> beach cleaning, flower/tree planting, beautification projects, recycling projects; <p>Health Agencies</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> volunteering in clinics, hospices, and donating blood (time required to donate); <p>Law Enforcement Agencies</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> volunteering for activities sponsored by the police; <p>Political Organizations</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> activities related to legitimate and recognized political organizations; <p>Senior Citizens</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> assisting in seniors' residences, providing services for seniors in the community; <p>Sports and Recreation</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> coaching, organizing special events, assisting with projects/events; or <p>Service Focused Club Activities</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> those activities that expand community service to others beyond the school day (holiday dinner participation, environmental action activities, etc.). 	<p>The ministry has developed a list of activities that may not be chosen as community involvement activities and that are therefore ineligible activities. An ineligible activity is an activity that:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> is a requirement of a class or course in which the student is enrolled (e.g., cooperative education portion of a course, job shadowing, work experience); takes place during the time allotted for the instructional program on a school day. However, an activity that takes place during the student's lunch breaks or "spare" periods is permissible; takes place in a factory, if the student is under fifteen years of age; takes place in a workplace other than a factory, if the student is under fourteen years of age and is not accompanied by an adult; would normally be performed for wages by a person in the workplace; involves the operation of a vehicle, power tools, or scaffolding; involves the administration of any type or form of medication or medical procedure to other persons; involves handling of substances classed as "designated substances" under the Occupational Health and Safety Act; requires the knowledge of a tradesperson whose trade is regulated by the government; involves banking or the handling of securities, or the handling of jewellery, works of art, antiques, or other valuables; consists of duties normally performed in the home (i.e., daily chores) or personal recreational activities; involves activities for a court-ordered program.
